## 2024 Policy Address consultation session for post-secondary students smoothly held (with photos)

The Deputy Chief Secretary for Administration, Mr Cheuk Wing-hing, attended a 2024 Policy Address consultation session today (August 20) to listen to the views and suggestions from post-secondary students on the upcoming Policy Address.
