Applications for admission tickets for Hong Kong Customs College open days begin

Applicants are required to specify the session they wish to join (one choice only), the number of admission tickets required (four is the maximum) and the preferred ticket collection point in the form. Admission tickets will be offered on a first-come, first-served basis. Successful applicants will be confirmed by email on or before November 12.

A free shuttle bus service between the HKCC and Sai Lau Kok Road in Tsuen Wan will be provided 30 minutes before the starting time of each session. Visitors may also use public transport to access the college. No parking spaces will be provided.

An open day session will be cancelled if Typhoon Signal No. 8 or above or the Black Rainstorm Warning is issued three hours before the event.
