REPORT FOR THE WEST END WARD — SATURDAY 2 AND SUNDAY 3 JULY 2022

Lochee Road (approach to Dudhope roundabout) — off-peak inside lane closure for concrete pouring works on Saturday 2 July and Tuesday 5 July.

REPORT FOR THE WEST END WARD — WEEK COMMENCING MONDAY 4 JULY 2022

South Tay Street — temporary traffic lights from Monday 27 June for 4 weeks for footway works.

Miller's Wynd — closed at its junction with Hawkhill for major construction works. Start date Monday 27 June for 6 months.

City Road at Baxter Street - 3-way temporary traffic lights from Monday 4 July for 3 days for CityFibre works.

Thomson Street (Seafield Lane for 50m south) — closed Wednesday 6 July for 2 weeks for Scottish Water work.

Milnbank Road at Bank Mill Road -2-way temporary traffic lights from Thursday 7 July for 3 days for CityFibre works.

Blackness Road (at Peddie Street) — temporary traffic lights Thursday 7 July for 2 weeks for Scotland Gas Network work.

Milnbank Road at Rosefield Street - 3-way temporary traffic lights from Monday 11 July for 3 days for CityFibre works.

Milnbank Road at Forest Park Road — 3-way temporary traffic lights from Thursday 14 July for 3 days for CityFibre works.

Hawkhill at Session Street - Lane closures from Monday 11 July for 5 days for

CityFibre works.

Minto Place — closed from Monday 11 July for 5 days for carriageway resurfacing works.

West Marketgait crossing at West Bell Street — Lane closures from Wednesday 13 July for 2 nights for CityFibre works.

Pennycook Lane — closed from Wednesday 20 July for 3 days for carriageway resurfacing works.

Ninewells Avenue — closed from Monday 25 July for 10 days for carriageway resurfacing works.

Hillcrest Road closed at No. 23 for 1 month for redevelopment works on existing house — closures will be intermittent and each should last no more than several days.

<u>Temporary Traffic Order - Thomson</u> Street



From the City Council:

Dundee City Council proposes to make an Order under Section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 for the purpose of facilitating Scottish Water sewer repair works. The Order is expected to be in force for two weeks from 6 July 2022. Its maximum duration in terms of the Act is eighteen months.

The effect of the Order is to prohibit temporarily all vehicular traffic in Thomson Street from Seafield Lane for a distance of 50 metres or thereby in a southerly direction.

An alternative route will be available via Perth Road, Roseangle and Magdalen Yard Road.

<u>Getting things done - Middlebank</u> <u>Crescent #dundeewestend</u>




We recently received complaints about the deteriorating condition of parts of the roadway of Middlebank Crescent.
