
<u>Blether Tay-Gither – Storytelling in</u> <u>Dundee – tonight!</u>

REPORT FOR WEST END WARD - WEEK COMMENCING MONDAY 27 JUNE 2022

South Tay Street – temporary traffic lights from Monday 27 June for 4 weeks for footway works.

Miller's Wynd – closed at its junction with Hawkhill for major construction works. Start date Monday 27 June for 6 months.

Dudhope Roundabout – lane closures from 9.00am on Friday 1 July to 6.00am on Saturday 2 July for Scottish Water work.

City Road at Logie Street – southbound lane closure from Wednesday 29 June for 2 days for CityFibre Works.

Forthcoming Roadworks

City Road at Baxter Street – 3-way temporary traffic lights from Monday 4 July for 3 days for CityFibre works.

Milnbank Road at Bankmill Road – 2-way temporary traffic lights from Thursday 7 July for 3 days for CityFibre works.

Milnbank Road at Rosefield Street – 3-way temporary traffic lights from Monday 11 July for 3 days for CityFibre works.

Milnbank Road at Forest Park Road — 3-way temporary traffic lights from Thursday 14 July for 3 days for CityFibre works.

Thomson Street (Seafield Lane for 50m south) - closed Wednesday 6 July for 2 weeks for Scottish Water work.


Minto Place (west leg) – closed from Monday 11 July for 5 days for carriageway resurfacing works.

Pennycook Lane – closed from Wednesday 20 July for 3 days for carriageway resurfacing works.

Ninewells Avenue — closed from Monday 25 July for 10 days for carriageway resurfacing works.

<u>Getting things done – Tullideph Road</u> <u>#dundeewestend</u>

The paths to the rear of the Tullideph Road flats near to the north end of Loganlee Terrace are in a poor state of repair and unfortuntealy there have been falls there. See photo below.



We raised this with the tenancy officer for the area who has since updated us as follows :

"I was out at the property and had a look at the paths.

From looking at the condition of the paths I have requested a site meeting with the repairs team to see what can be done to repair the paths.

As soon as the site visit has taken place I will update you with the agreed course of action."

We reported this to the City Council and have now received the following update from environment management :

"We are struggling to get contractors in just now and most local authorities are requesting similar issues with play installers.

This has had a knock on effect internally too as we have had a few retirements and we are currently recruiting.

We are working through various works in parks and it is key that we have safe play areas and will get to repairs as soon as we can.

I can only apologise for the delay."

We will keep residents updated on this as we are anxious to see repairs take place as soon as possible.
