## Getting things done – Lochee Park – an update #dundeewestend



Residents recall my update in March giving the positive response I had received from the City Council's environment management team about installing further picnic tables at Lochee Park.

I was advised at the time that delivery was to be taking place soon so, last week, I sought an update on installation.

The Project Officer in the council's Neighbourhood Services team has now updated me as follows :

**"I met with a colleague last week and agreed the positions for two picnic benches.**

**I have since instructed our chargehand to install concrete bases for the benches. We have the benches in stock at Caird Park.**

**Once installed, hopefully next week, the concrete will require at least a week to cure before drilling and bolting down the benches.**

**Therefore approx 2 to 3 weeks for the bench fitting."**
