<u>Tenders invited for licence of fee-paying public car park</u>

The Government Property Agency (GPA) is inviting tenders for a threeyear licence of a fee-paying public car park on portions of the First Floor of Sai Kung Government Offices, 34 Chan Man Street, Sai Kung, New Territories, Hong Kong.

The premises should only be used for the purpose of a fee-paying public car park for the parking of private cars.

Tenderers must submit their tenders by placing them in the Government Logistics Department Tender Box situated on the Ground Floor, North Point Government Offices, 333 Java Road, North Point, Hong Kong, before noon on May 22. Late tenders will not be accepted.

Property owner fined over \$15,000 for failing to comply with fire safety direction

An owner was convicted and fined \$15,825 at the Fanling Magistrates' Courts on April 16 for failing to comply with a fire safety direction issued under the Fire Safety (Buildings) Ordinance (FS(B)0) (Cap. 572).

The Buildings Department (BD) issued a fire safety direction under section 5(2)(a)(ii) of the FS(B)0 to the owner of a domestic flat in a 58-year-old composite building at San Cheung Street, Sheung Shui, requiring the owner to comply with the fire safety construction requirement by providing a fire-rated door at the unit entrance which opens directly to a staircase.

Failing to comply with the statutory direction, the owner was prosecuted

by the BD and was convicted and fined by the court.

"According to the FS(B)0, failing to comply with a statutory direction issued under the ordinance without reasonable excuse is a serious offence. The BD may instigate prosecution proceedings against the owner", a spokesman for the BD said today (April 30).

Pursuant to section 5(8) of the FS(B)0, any person who, without reasonable excuse, fails to comply with a statutory direction, commits an offence and is liable on conviction to a fine at level 4 (\$25,000 at present) and to a further fine of \$2,500 for each day of non-compliance. Upon conviction, an application may also be made to the court for a fire safety compliance order against the owner under section 6(1) of the FS(B)0 directing the owner to comply with the requirements of the direction.

resumes charging parking fee with effective from May 1

The Transport Department today (April 30) reminded members of the public that, as announced by the Transport Bureau of Macao, the charging for parking light vehicles at the East Car Park of the Hong Kong-Zhuhai-Macao Bridge (HZMB) Macao Frontier Post at a uniform parking fee of MOP\$10 per hour or any part of an hour will resume from midnight on May 1 (Wednesday).

By then, all light vehicles using the East Car Park (including private cars holding regular quotas, as well as private cars under Northbound Travel for Hong Kong Vehicles or HZMB Macao Port Park-and-Ride Scheme) are required to pay parking fees.
