Company fined \$69,300 for contravening Employment Ordinance

Dragon Luck Asia Limited was prosecuted by the Labour Department (LD) for violation of the requirements under the Employment Ordinance (E0). The company pleaded guilty at the Eastern Magistrates' Courts today (April 26) and was fined \$69,300.

The company wilfully and without reasonable excuse contravened the requirement of the EO, failing to pay six employees' wages within seven days after the expiry of the wage periods, totalling about \$546,000.

"The ruling helps disseminate a strong message to all employers that they have to pay wages to employees within the statutory time limit stipulated in the EO," a spokesman for LD said.

"The LD will not tolerate these offences and will spare no effort in enforcing the law and safeguarding employees' statutory rights," the spokesman added.

The Transport Department (TD) today (April 26) announced that the 51st Personalised Vehicle Registration Marks (PVRMs) Scheme will be open for

applications from May 1 to 31, 2024.

Starting from May 1, 2024, applications will be invited for the allocation of PVRMs upon sale by auction. Completed application forms should reach the TD no later than May 31, 2024. If there are more than 1 500 applications, those to be considered will be selected by lot.

The application form (TD 569) and the Guidance Notes for Application can be downloaded from the TD's website (www.td.gov.hk/en/public_services/vehicle_registration_mark/pvrm_application/index.html) or obtained from the TD's Licensing Offices as well as the Home Affairs Enquiry Centres of the Home Affairs Department.
