Police appeal to public to keep a safe distance from dangerous items

Last night (November 18), rioters wreaked havoc and hurled numerous petrol bombs in Kowloon. This morning (November 18), Police officers of Yau Tsim District received multiple reports from members of the public that a large amount of dangerous items, including corrosive fluid and petrol bombs,
