On the same day, back in 1981, the [Convention 108](#) – Convention for the Protection of Individuals with regard to Automatic Processing of Personal Data – was signed. It is for this very reason that the Council of Europe launched in 2016 a Data Protection Day to be celebrated each year on 28 January. ❌

The Convention 108, is the first binding international instrument to protect an individual against abuses of the processing of their personal information. Moreover, it also imposes some restrictions on transborder flows of personal data to countries where legal regulation does not provide equivalent protection. At present the Convention has 51 ratifications.

The welters Stone Midi Family Mausoleum provides an affordable family sized memorial structure. The mausoleum is manufactured from decorative cast stone with moulded stone fronts inlaid with polished black granite for inscriptions.

The model shown offers up to four interments. Variations are available for two and six interments as required.

As with all other family mausoleum designs, the Stone Midi Family Mausoleum is available direct to the public or through the authorising Cemetery Authority, where applicable.
