CHP investigates 3 986 confirmed and 2 720 asymptomatic additional SARS-CoV-2 virus cases with 5 334 cases pending status by nucleic acid tests as well as 14 868 cases tested positive by rapid antigen tests

The Centre for Health Protection (CHP) of the Department of Health (DH) today (March 14) announced the latest epidemic situation of COVID-19. As of 0.00am, March 14, the CHP was investigating 12 040 additional cases that tested positive for the SARS-CoV-2 virus by nucleic acid tests (3 986 confirmed cases, 2 720 asymptomatic cases and 5 334 cases with pending case status) in the past 24 hours. Separately, 14 868 additional positive cases through rapid antigen tests (RAT) (10 597 symptomatic cases and 4 271 asymptomatic cases) were reported. Hong Kong has recorded a total of 635 675 and 98 110 cases that tested positive by nucleic acid tests and RAT respectively for the SARS-CoV-2 virus so far.

The aforementioned newly reported cases tested positive by nucleic acid tests and by RAT are all locally acquired cases. The CHP is continuing with epidemiological investigations on the cases. In addition, as of 0.00am, March 14, a total of 4 066 deaths related to COVID-19 during the fifth wave (since December 31, 2021) was recorded, with 4 057 and nine deaths reported from the Hospital Authority and public mortuaries respectively. Hong Kong has so far recorded a total of 4 279 deaths related to COVID-19.

Furthermore, among the earlier cases by nucleic acid tests reported, there were cases (including pending cases) changed to confirmed, asymptomatic or re-positive cases. As at yesterday (March 13), the total number of confirmed cases was 259 425, while the figures for asymptomatic cases, re-positive cases, pending/unknown cases recorded since January 1 were 126 392, 10 and 237 808 respectively.

The spokesman for the CHP stressed that the local situation of COVID-19 infection became severe recently and there is a continuous increase in the number of cases involving mutant strains that carry higher transmissibility. With the higher transmissibility and risk of infection of the Omicron mutant strain, the CHP strongly appeals to the community to continue to comply with the social distancing measures, avoid going out and refrain from participating in unnecessary or crowded activities or gatherings (particularly religious or cross-family activities and gatherings). This

would lower the risk of infection and prevent the virus from spreading in the community.

â€<The spokesman reminded that COVID-19 vaccines are highly effective in preventing severe cases and deaths from the SARS-CoV-2 virus. They can provide effective protection to those vaccinated in preventing serious complications and even death after infection. People who are yet to receive vaccination, especially senior citizens, chronic patients and other immunocompromised persons who face a higher chance of death after COVID-19 infection, should get vaccinated as early as possible for self-protection and to reduce the risk of falling seriously ill and death should they get infected. Meanwhile, a person who gets COVID-19 and influenza at the same time may be more seriously ill and would have a higher risk of death. Influenza vaccination may reduce the likelihood of hospitalisation and the length of stay. In addition, seasonal influenza vaccination is recommended for all persons aged 6 months or above except those with known contraindications. Persons at higher risk of getting influenza and its complications, including the elderly and children, should receive seasonal influenza vaccination early.
