<u>RAWFILL: supporting a new circular</u> <u>economy for RAW materials recovered</u> <u>from landFILLs</u>

BGS is a partner on a new project that is seeking to improve our ability to mine old landfill sites to recover useful resources and reclaim valuable land. RAWFILL is funded through the EU Interreg Programme, and will run for three years. The project involves eight partners from across North-West Europe. The role of BGS is to develop new geophysical approaches for characterising landfills.
