FRA supports Roma data collection in Czechia

Funded by the Norway Grants in Czechia the project should be implemented between 2020 and 2024. It aims at preparing a methodology tailored to the country for ethnic data collection tested in two waves of sample surveys. This will provide data on the situation of Roma in Czechia.

FRA is a programme partner for the <u>Human Rights</u>, <u>Roma Inclusion and Empowerment and Domestic and Gender-based Violence</u> programme. FRA provides a methodological support to the project promoter using experiences from its <u>EU minorities and discrimination</u>, and <u>Roma and Travellers</u> surveys. This should lead to Roma data that is comparable with those collected in other EU countries (either by FRA — <u>Roma Survey 2020</u> or by national statistical offices — <u>Slovakia</u> or <u>Bulgaria</u>).

The data will help monitor the implementation of the EU framework for the Roma inclusion planned after 2020. The <u>Research Institute for Labour and Social Affairs</u>, the project promoter, organised the meeting.
