finds significantly reduced income for good causes from the National Lottery, said:

"This

report should set serious alarm bells ringing for those who are supposed to act

as stewards for the National Lottery.

"The point

of the Lottery is to maximise returns for good causes not maximise returns for

the company holding the operating licence.

"While

Camelot have seen their shareholder profits from the Lottery rocket since 2010

the amount going to good causes over the same period has risen by a measly 2%,

and the 15% drop in good causes income in the last year is particularly worrying.

"If money

for good causes is being hit by consumers moving towards scratchcards and away

from lottery draws then Camelot needs to act to address this, not hide behind it.

"It's now

clear that good causes are losing out while Camelot continues to win the jackpot. The Government must act urgently to ensure Camelot does better- and quickly."
