<u>Government tightens boarding and</u> <u>quarantine requirements for places</u> <u>with Omicron cases detected</u>

The Government announced today (December 23) that in view of the latest global developments of the COVID-19 pandemic situation, Guadeloupe, Guernsey, Saint Martin (French part) and Venezuela will be specified as Group A specified places from 0.00am on December 26 to tighten the boarding and quarantine requirements for relevant inbound travellers.

As a preventive measure and with reference to the relevant risks, the Government will specify overseas places that have detected Omicron cases as Group A specified places. Noting that the detection of Omicron cases was confirmed in Guadeloupe, Guernsey, Saint Martin (French part) and Venezuela, the Government will specify them as Group A specified places from 0.00am on December 26. Non-Hong Kong residents who have stayed there within 21 days will not be allowed to enter Hong Kong. Hong Kong residents can only board a flight for Hong Kong if they have been fully vaccinated and hold a recognised vaccination record. They will have to undergo compulsory quarantine in a designated quarantine hotel for 21 days upon returning to Hong Kong, with six tests to be conducted during quarantine, followed by compulsory testing in a community testing centre on the 26th day of arrival in Hong Kong.

The Government will gazette the relevant updated specifications under the Prevention and Control of Disease (Regulation of Cross-boundary Conveyances and Travellers) Regulation (Cap. 599H) to effect the above measures.
