In response to the findings of the Women and Equalities Committee on the harrasment that women and girls face on the street [1], Green Party of England and Wales deputy leader Amelia Womack stated that efforts to make misogyny a hate crime must be implemented at the community leader.

“The #metoo movement has underlined our need for a major culture shift, to change the way women are treated in our society.
