The foam board, comprising the election mascots, Ballot Box Family, i.e. Blue Ballot, Red Ballot and Grandpa Ballot, allows members of the public to take photos to leave them with fond memories and enhance the vibe on the election day."

In addition, to appeal to the public to work together to build a better community, a television station released a theme song "Build a Better Community Beneath the Lion Rock ". It originates from the popular song "Beneath the Lion Rock" with new lyrics, and is sung by a group of popular movie and television stars, with a view to inspiring the public to build a better community and a better Hong Kong together.

The Government spokesman emphasised, "The arrangements are purely for the enjoyment of the public and the enhancement of the public's concerns and caring on the reformed DCs and the DC election.
