

# Heritage Fiesta cum Roving Exhibition 2021 to launch in September

The Heritage Fiesta cum Roving Exhibition 2021 will be held from September to December. The Heritage Fiesta will feature 11 revitalisation projects of government-owned historic buildings from September 1 to October 31 with free guided tours, while the roving exhibition will be held from September 1 to December 31.

"The revitalisation projects of government-owned historic buildings featured in this event showcase the concerted conservation efforts between the Government and non-profit-making organisations. Some of the projects have also received honours from the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization Asia-Pacific Awards for Cultural Heritage Conservation. We wish to encourage the public to visit and appreciate these historic gems constructed across different times, and understand their histories and architectural features through the event," a spokesman for the Commissioner for Heritage's Office of the Development Bureau said today (August 25).

The participating historic buildings include 10 projects under Batches I to III of the Revitalising Historic Buildings Through Partnership Scheme, namely Tai O Heritage Hotel (Old Tai O Police Station), Hong Kong Baptist University School of Chinese Medicine – Lui Seng Chun (Lui Seng Chun), YHA Mei Ho House Youth Hostel (Mei Ho House), Jao Tsung-I Academy (Former Lai Chi Kok Hospital), Green Hub (Old Tai Po Police Station), Stone Houses Family Garden (Stone Houses), Viva Blue House (The Blue House Cluster), Hong Kong News-Expo (Bridges Street Market), The HKFYG Leadership Institute (Former Fanling Magistracy) and Haw Par Music (Haw Par Mansion), as well as PMQ (Former Police Married Quarters on Hollywood Road) under the "Conserving Central" initiative. Free guided tours will be offered during the event period on a first-come, first-served basis. The public can also visit the historic buildings during the opening hours and collect uniquely designed stamps.

The roving exhibition will be held at the following government venues, shopping malls and museum:

During the event period, pamphlets of the Heritage Fiesta cum Roving Exhibition 2021 will be available for free at the participating historic buildings, exhibition venues, the Hong Kong Museum of History, the Hong Kong Heritage Discovery Centre, the Hong Kong Museum of Art, the Hong Kong Science Museum, the Hong Kong Space Museum, the Hong Kong Heritage Museum, the Ping Shan Tang Clan Gallery cum Heritage Trail Visitors Centre, the Dr Sun Yat-sen Museum, the Flagstaff House Museum of Tea Ware and the Cattle Depot. The pamphlets can also be collected at the Tung Wah Group of Hospitals' temples, MM2 Cafe, Man Mo Lounge and The School, Yaumatei, as well as visitor centres of the Hong Kong Tourism Board in Tsim Sha Tsui and at the Peak and Hong Kong International Airport.
