HKETO, Brussels supports Hong Kong films in France and Spain (with photos)

The Hong Kong Economic and Trade Office, Brussels (HKETO, Brussels) is supporting the participation of Hong Kong films in the Festival des 3 Continents, a film festival being held in Nantes, France, from November 19 to 26 (Nantes time).

The Hong Kong film industry can continue to flourish because of Hong Kong's diverse and international culture, the city's strong protection of freedom of expression, and a solid legal system that protects the intellectual property rights of artists and producers.

HKETO, Brussels also supported the participation of Hong Kong films in the 7th Asian Film Festival in Barcelona, Spain, which ran from October 30 to November 10. The festival screened five recent Hong Kong films, including "Still Human", whose leading actress, Crisel Consunji, attended the event.
