Hong Kong Customs seizes suspected dangerous drugs worth about \$3.3 million (with photo)

Hong Kong Customs seized about 3 kilograms of suspected cocaine and about 26 grams of suspected crack cocaine with a total estimated market value of about \$3.3 million in Tai Koo on May 23. A 20-year-old man suspected to be connected with the case was arrested on May 25.

During an anti-narcotics operation conducted in the vicinity of Tai Koo on May 23, Customs searched a residential premises. Upon inspection, the batch of suspected cocaine and suspected crack cocaine was seized inside the premises. After a follow-up investigation, Customs officers intercepted a man who was entering the premises on May 25 and arrested him immediately.

The arrested man was laid with a holding charge with one count of trafficking in a dangerous drug. He will appear at the Kwun Tong Magistrates' Courts tomorrow (May 27).

Under the Dangerous Drugs Ordinance, trafficking in a dangerous drug is a serious offence. The maximum penalty upon conviction is a fine of \$5 million and life imprisonment.
