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In addition, a 77-year-old male patient in a mixed gender surgical ward of United Christian Hospital tested positive for COVID-19 on August 30. The hospital commenced contact tracing investigation and has identified four more patients (three male patients and one female patient), aged 52 to 83, who tested positive. All five patients are being treated under isolation with stable condition.

The hospital is investigating the linkage of the cases concerned. Visiting arrangements for the ward concerned have been suspended. Thorough cleaning and disinfection have been conducted. Testing has been arranged for patients and staff members of the ward concerned. The hospital will continue to monitor the health condition of patients and staff members closely, and communicate with the Centre for Health Protection on the latest situation.
