<u>Inspection of aquatic products</u> <u>imported from Japan</u>

As at noon today (August 25), the Centre for Food Safety (CFS) of the Food and Environmental Hygiene Department has conducted tests on radiological level of 138 food samples imported from Japan, which were of the "aquatic products, seaweeds and sea salt" category. No sample was found to have exceeded the safety limit. In parallel, the Agriculture, Fisheries and Conservation Department (AFCD) has also tested 50 samples of local catch for radiological tests. All the samples passed the tests. Details can be found at AFCD's website (www.afcd.gov.hk/english/fisheries/Radiological_testing/Radiological_Test.htm 1).

From 24 August to noon today, CFS and AFCD have conducted tests on radiological level of 253 samples of food imported from Japan and 100 samples of local catch respectively. All the samples passed the tests.
