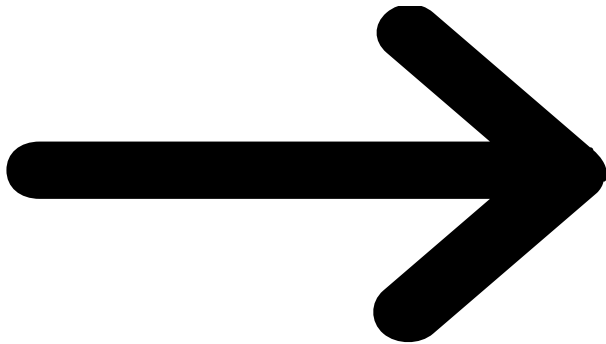


Jackson Carlaw's New Year message
