## Large-scale lantern carnivals to celebrate Mid-Autumn Festival (with photos)

Further to the interactive lighting installation "The Moon Machine", which has been displayed at the Hong Kong Cultural Centre Piazza since September 15, the Leisure and Cultural Services Department (LCSD) will showcase spectacular lantern displays of different themes at the Mid-Autumn Lantern Carnivals in Victoria Park, Sha Tin Park and Tuen Mun Park from tomorrow (September 23) until October 2. The lantern displays will be lit up from 6.30pm to 11pm daily, with lighting hours extended to midnight on the Mid-Autumn Day (September 29).

A vast range of activities will be organised in the three abovementioned parks at different dates. A fire dragon dance parade, as well as a paid programme, the grand finale of the Chinese Opera Festival 2023 "Bless This Land – Cantonese Opera Showcase under the Bamboo Theatre", will be held in Victoria Park; while youth shows and a gala night will be staged at Sha Tin Park and Tuen Mun Park respectively.
