Members of the Advisory Council on National Records and Archives are remunerated £386 per day.

These reappointments have been made in accordance with the <u>Cabinet Office's</u> <u>Governance Code on Public Appointments</u>. The process is regulated by the Commissioner for Public Appointments. The Government's Governance Code requires that any significant political activity undertaken by an appointee in the last five years is declared. This is defined as including holding

office, public speaking, making a recordable donation or candidature for election. Liz Copper has declared no activity.
