## Midwife shortage due to Government underfunding is failing families in their time of need — Justin Madders

## Justin Madders MP, Labour's Shadow Health Minister, responding

to today's Royal College of Midwives report on agency spending in the NHS, said:

"The Government's management of

the NHS workforce has been a disaster for both staff and patients. The country

is now 3,500 short of the number of midwives needed and the RCM say almost £100m is being used to plug the gaps with temporary staff.

## "It's essential that hospitals are

able to get the right number of midwives in place to keep mothers and their babies safe. Labour's research published earlier this year showed a huge rise in temporary closures of maternity units because of short staffing. The Government's underfunding of the NHS is failing families in their time of need.

## "Ministers must step in with a

long term workforce plan for the NHS and they should put an end to the self-defeating pay cap. At the moment too much money is going to employment agencies when it should be going to frontline patient care."
