

Operator and managers of unlicensed guesthouses fined

Two women and a man were fined from \$10,000 to \$15,000 at the Kowloon City Magistrates' Courts today (September 4) for contravening the Hotel and Guesthouse Accommodation Ordinance.

The courts heard that from February to April this year, officers of the Office of the Licensing Authority (OLA), the Home Affairs Department, inspected three suspected unlicensed guesthouses on Wong Chuk Street in Sham Shui Po, Changsha Street in Mong Kok and Nam Kok Road in Kowloon City. During the inspections, the OLA officers posed as lodgers and successfully rented rooms or "capsule-like accommodation" in these guesthouses on a daily basis.

According to the OLA's records, these guesthouses did not possess licences under the Ordinance on the days of inspection. The man and women responsible for operating and managing the premises were charged with contravening section 5(1) of the Ordinance.

A department spokesman stressed that operating or managing an unlicensed guesthouse is a criminal offence and will lead to a criminal record. Upon conviction, the offender is liable to a maximum fine of \$200,000 and two years' imprisonment.
