"Furthermore, we would like to express our gratitude to members of the public who have actively responded to our public engagement programmes starting from February as part of our exhibition. Our exhibition is enriched by the toys lent and photographs provided by them.

"Through the public engagement programmes, we have collected toys from the 1950s to the 1980s, including dolls, roly-poly toys and models of robots. Meanwhile, we have also acquired photographs taken in places like playgrounds, amusement parks and exhibitions. These toys and photographs are part of our precious collective memory.

"The toys and photographs collection programmes will conclude on November 30. Members of the public are encouraged to take the opportunity to make their generous contributions by lending toys and providing photographs to us.
