On the day of remembrance in memory of all victims of the Foibe massacres during World War II, Vice-President McGuiness said that defending democracy and tolerance is the best tribute to the victims.

#### New MEPs and committee members

The <u>distribution of seats in the European Parliament</u> and the <u>numerical composition of its committees</u> have changed after Brexit. Vice-President <u>McGuinness</u> announced the <u>new MEPs</u> whose mandates started on 1 February, as well as those of the <u>departing British and Northern Irish MEPs</u>, whose term ended with the withdrawal of the United Kingdom on 31 January.

The Vice-President also announced the corresponding <u>changes to the membership</u> <u>of Parliament's permanent committees</u>.
