

# Proposed extension of footbridge and road works in Kwun Tong gazetted

The Government gazetted today (February 26) the proposed road works at Shing Yip Street in Kwun Tong and the extension of the footbridge across Lei Yue Mun Road near Tsui Ping Road to improve the barrier-free access provisions at the southern end of the footbridge and facilitate the future property development at Cha Kwo Ling Road.

Any person who wishes to object to the works or the use, or both, is required to address to the Secretary for Transport and Housing an objection in writing, which can be submitted via the following means:

A notice of objection should describe the objector's interest and the manner in which he or she alleges that he or she will be affected by the works or the use. Objectors are requested to provide contact details to facilitate communication. A notice of objection should be delivered to the Secretary for Transport and Housing not later than April 27, 2021.
