

Proposed road works at Tan Kwai Tsuen in Yuen Long gazetted

The Government gazetted today (July 16) the proposed road works to provide an access to the public housing development near Tan Kwai Tsuen in Yuen Long and to serve future traffic demand.

Any person who wishes to object to the works or the use, or both, is required to address to the Secretary for Transport and Housing an objection in writing, which can be submitted via the following means:

A notice of objection should describe the objector's interest and the manner in which he or she alleges that he or she will be affected by the works or the use. Objectors are requested to provide contact details to facilitate communication. A notice of objection should be delivered to the
