

# Proposed upgrading of remaining sections of Kam Tin Road and Lam Kam Road gazetted

The Government gazetted today (September 17) the proposed road works to upgrade the section of Kam Tin Road between Tung Wui Road and Lam Kam Road and the section of Lam Kam Road between Kam Tin Road and Kadoorie Farm and Botanic Garden for enhancement of road safety.

A notice of objection should describe the objector's interest and the manner in which he or she alleges that he or she will be affected by the works or the use.
