

# Proposed upgrading works of pedestrian subway at Salisbury Road gazetted

The Government gazetted today (August 25) the proposed works, including the construction of a lift, at the pedestrian subway (No. KS61) across Salisbury Road near Chatham Road South in Tsim Sha Tsui to improve the barrier-free access provisions at its southern end.

Any person who wishes to object to the works or the use, or both, is required to address to the Secretary for Transport and Logistics an objection in writing, which can be submitted via the following means:

A notice of objection should describe the objector's interest and the manner in which he or she alleges that he or she will be affected by the works or the use. Objectors are requested to provide contact details to facilitate communication. A notice of objection should be delivered to the Secretary for Transport and Logistics not later than October 24, 2023.
