

# Proposed works of coastal pedestrian access in Tung Chung gazetted

The Government gazetted today (May 25) the proposed works to provide a coastal pedestrian access in Tung Chung which is required to serve the anticipated traffic demand induced by the Tung Chung New Town Extension project.

Any person who wishes to object to the works or the use, or both, is required to address to the Secretary for Transport and Housing an objection in writing, which can be submitted via the following means:
