SHA and DC chairmen and vice chairmen continue to visit Guangdong-HK-Macao Greater Bay Area (with photos)

In the evening, the delegation will visit Lingnan Tiandi to learn about heritage conservation and old town revitalisation.

The delegation will depart for Zhongshan tomorrow (September 9) to visit the Shenzhen-Zhongshan Link in the morning, and will travel to Zhuhai to tour the Zhuhai Grand Theatre and the Hong Kong-Zhuhai-Macao Bridge in the afternoon, thus concluding the visit.
