<u>Structure of orchards in 2017 – Two-</u> <u>thirds of the EU's fruit plantation</u> <u>area is concentrated in Spain, Italy</u> <u>and Poland</u>

Almost 1.3 million hectares (ha) of land in the **European Union** (EU) were covered with fruit trees in 2017. A little over one third of this total was accounted for by apple orchards (473 500 ha, 37%), and another one fifth by orange groves (255 500 ha, 20%). Of the remainder, peach orchards covered 190 500 ha (15%), small citrus fruit trees producing satsumas and clementines in particular covered 139 600 ha (11%), pear trees covered 100 400 ha (8%), apricots covered 75 700 ha (6%) and lemon groves a further 60 100 ha (5%). The area planted with fruit trees accounted for around 1% of utilised agriculture area (173 million ha in 2016).
