# Adjustment in ceiling prices for dedicated LPG filling stations in January 2024

The Electrical and Mechanical Services Department (EMSD) today (December 22) announced an adjustment to the auto-LPG (liquefied petroleum gas) ceiling prices for dedicated LPG filling stations from January 1 to January 31, 2024, in accordance with the terms and conditions of the contracts of the dedicated LPG filling stations.

A department spokesman said that the adjustment on January 1, 2024, will reflect the movement of the LPG international price in December 2023. The adjusted auto-LPG ceiling prices for dedicated LPG filling stations will range from \$3.66 to \$4.53 per litre, amounting to a decrease of \$0.00 to \$0.01 per litre.

The spokesman said that the auto-LPG ceiling prices were adjusted according to a pricing formula specified in the contracts. The formula comprises two elements — the LPG international price and the LPG operating price. The LPG international price refers to the LPG international price of the preceding month. The LPG operating price is adjusted on February 1 and June 1 annually according to the average movement of the Composite Consumer Price Index and the Nominal Wage Index.

# <u>Taxi Service Commendation Scheme 2023</u> <u>opens for public nominations</u>

The Transport Department (TD) today (December 22) said that to promote the quality services and image of the taxi industry, the TD and the Committee on Taxi Service Quality (CTSQ) are co-organising the Taxi Service Commendation Scheme 2023.

To recognise the quality services provided by taxi drivers and management team, a total of 24 awards will be granted in the scheme this year, including 20 Quality Taxi Drivers awards, one Most Popular Taxi Driver award, two Good Driver, Good Service awards, and one Quality Taxi Service Management Team award. The scheme is now open for nominations all year round.

Members of the public can nominate quality taxi drivers and service management teams, as well as share the Good Driver, Good Service riding experience provided by a taxi driver, via the CTSQ's webpage (<a href="www.ctsq.org.hk/voting">www.ctsq.org.hk/voting</a>) by scanning the QR code on the promotion material of the scheme (see Annex). The Quality Taxi Service Management Team award will be evaluated and selected by an assessment panel of the CTSQ. It is expected that the award presentation ceremony will be held in the third quarter of 2024.
