# <u>Inspection of aquatic products</u> <u>imported from Japan</u>

In response to the Japanese Government's plan to discharge nuclear-contaminated water at the Fukushima Nuclear Power Station, the Director of Food and Environmental Hygiene issued a Food Safety Order which prohibits all aquatic products, sea salt and seaweeds originating from the 10 metropolis/prefectures, namely Tokyo, Fukushima, Ibaraki, Miyagi, Chiba, Gunma, Tochigi, Niigata, Nagano and Saitama, from being imported into and supplied in Hong Kong.

For other Japanese aquatic products, sea salt, and seaweeds that are not prohibited from being imported into Hong Kong, the Centre for Food Safety (CFS) of the Food and Environmental Hygiene Department will conduct comprehensive radiological tests to verify that the radiation levels of these products do not exceed the guideline levels before they are allowed to be supplied in the market.

As the discharge of nuclear-contaminated water is unprecedented and will continue for 30 years or more, the Government will closely monitor and step up the testing arrangements. Should anomalies be detected, the Government does not preclude further tightening the scope of the import ban.

From noon on December 11 to noon today (December 12), the CFS conducted tests on the radiological levels of 174 food samples imported from Japan, which were of the "aquatic and related products, seaweeds and sea salt" category. No sample was found to have exceeded the safety limit. Details can be found on the CFS's thematic website titled "Control Measures on Foods Imported from Japan"

In parallel, the Agriculture, Fisheries and Conservation Department (AFCD) has also tested 50 samples of local catch for radiological levels. All the samples passed the tests. The Hong Kong Observatory (HKO) has also enhanced the environmental monitoring of the local waters. No anomaly has been detected so far. From August 24 to noon today, the CFS and the AFCD have conducted tests on the radiological levels of 19 496 samples of food imported from Japan (including 12 928 samples of aquatic and related products, seaweeds and sea salt) and 5 464 samples of local catch respectively. All the samples passed the tests.

# Hong Kong Customs combats unfair trade practices at beauty parlour

Hong Kong Customs today (December 12) arrested a saleswoman of a beauty parlour suspected of engaging in unfair trade practices involving misleading omission in the course of selling a beauty treatment, in contravention of the Trade Descriptions Ordinance (TDO).

Customs earlier received information alleging that a salesperson of a beauty parlour in Causeway Bay, in the course of selling a facial beauty treatment service, was suspected of hiding material information by failing to provide a customer with a sales contract and disclose relevant terms and conditions, which misled the customer to purchase the beauty service.

After investigation, Customs officers today arrested a saleswoman, aged 43, of the beauty parlour concerned.

An investigation is ongoing and the arrestee has been released on bail pending further investigation.

Customs reminds traders to comply with the requirements of the TDO and consumers to procure services at reputable shops.

Under the TDO, any trader who engages in a commercial practice that omits or hides material information or provides material information in a manner that is unclear, unintelligible, ambiguous or untimely, and as a result causes, or is likely to cause, an average consumer to make a transactional decision commits an offence. The maximum penalty upon conviction is a fine of \$500,000 and imprisonment for five years.

# <u>Lists of appointed members and ex</u> <u>officio members of District Councils</u> <u>announced</u>

has, in accordance with the District Councils Ordinance, appointed 179 persons as members of the seventh-term District Councils (DCs) (2024-27) for a term of office of four years starting from January 1, 2024.

The registration of 27 incumbent Chairmen of Rural Committees as ex officio members has also been confirmed as valid in accordance with the District Councils Ordinance.

To fully implement the principle of "patriots administering Hong Kong" and bring the DCs back on track to fulfil their mission to serve the community, the Government has improved governance at the district level and reformed the DCs. The reformed DCs are more broadly represented, comprising appointed members, members returned from the District Committees constituency and District Council geographical constituency elections, and ex officio members, allowing those who love the country and Hong Kong and are committed to serving the community to participate in the work of DCs through multiple channels.

A Government spokesman said, "Under the principle of meritocracy, the Government has appointed 179 persons of high calibre who love our country and Hong Kong to serve as appointed members of the seventh-term DCs having regard to the situations and development needs of individual districts and factors such as community representativeness and ties with local communities. All the 179 appointed members who are dedicated to serving the community will enhance the advisory and service functions of DCs."

The majority of the newly appointed members are young to middle-aged, representing different social strata, sectors and professions, and achieving a balanced and diverse composition in the DCs for the coming term —

In terms of age, the median age is 47, with about 81 per cent aged between 40 and 64, and about 15 per cent are young people aged below 40. The youngest is 23 years old;

In terms of sectors, they are representatives or members of the industrial and commercial, professional, grassroots and labour sectors, district organisations and etc;

In terms of professions, school principals and teachers, lawyers, healthcare practitioners, social workers, engineering surveyors, accountants, and practitioners in insurance and financial services are covered; and

In districts where there are bigger ethnic-minority communities, representatives of ethnic minorities are appointed to assist the Government in liaising with ethnic minorities and delivering services to them.

The spokesman added, "The District Council Eligibility Review Committee has reviewed and confirmed the eligibility of all appointed members, and the eligibility of Chairmen of the Rural Committees for registration as ex officio members, including their compliance with the legal requirements of upholding the Basic Law of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region and

bearing allegiance to the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region."
