Following is the speech by the Secretary for Innovation, Technology and Industry, Professor Sun Dong, at the Hong Kong-Shenzhen Innovation and Technology (I&T) Park Partnership Launching Ceremony today (April 18):

Chief Executive, Mr John Lee, Acting Financial Secretary, Mr Michael Wong, distinguished guests, representatives of our Partnership enterprises, ladies and gentlemen,

Good morning. It gives me great pleasure to join you all at today's Hong Kong-Shenzhen I&T Park (HSITP) Partnership Launching Ceremony. First of all, I would like to congratulate the HSITP Limited for bringing together such a big group of valued partners.

To grow the innovation and technology sector, we need a vibrant ecosystem supported by a close collaboration between various sectors. This is the prefect reason to explain the diverse representation here today. Among the some 60 companies or organisations, we have representatives from the industry, academia and R&D (research and development) institutions, as well as the investment sector. About a quarter of companies are from overseas, including the United States, France, Japan, the United Kingdom, Australia, Thailand and Singapore. The Leisure and Cultural Services Department announced today (April 18) that due to big waves, red flag has been hoisted at Hap Mun Bay Beach in Sai Kung District. Beachgoers are advised not to swim at the beach.

### Fatal traffic accident in Castle Peak

Police are investigating a fatal traffic accident in Castle Peak in the small hours today (April 18) in which two men and a woman died.

At 3.23am, a private car driven by a 25-year-old man was travelling along Tuen Mun Road towards Kowloon. Upon approaching near Siu Lam, the car reportedly lost control and rammed into the right side kerb before hitting an overhead sign gantry.

Police officers sped to the scene. Sustaining serious head injuries, the male driver was certified dead at scene. Sustaining multiple injuries, a 26-year-old male passenger and a 23-year-old female passenger were rushed to Tuen Mun Hospital in unconscious state and were certified dead at 4.06am and 9.19am respectively.

Investigation by the Special Investigation Team of Traffic, New Territories North is underway.

Following is the speech by the Chief Executive, Mr John Lee, at the Hong Kong-Shenzhen Innovation and Technology Park Partnership Launching Ceremony today (April 18):

Distinguished guests, ladies and gentlemen,

Good morning. I'm delighted to be here with you today, for the Partnership Launching Ceremony of the Hong Kong-Shenzhen Innovation and Technology (I&T) Park.

This morning's ceremony is a milestone in the development of the I&T Park — one that resonates far beyond the Park's reach, along Hong Kong's boundary with Shenzhen.

Some 60 companies and organisations are taking part in today's ceremony. They come from Hong Kong and the Mainland, as well as seven countries in the Asia Pacific, Europe and North America. As Hong Kong prospers with your companies, we will also continue to join hands with Shenzhen, to work out various innovative and cross-boundary facilitation measures for the benefit of our partners in the Park, and beyond.
