Money worries, debt or benefits concerns?

The following information provides useful financial advice and contact numbers :

They can also help with form filling and will refer you to the other support services, including those who help with legal issues, such as Dundee North Law, and those who help with problems around gas/electric, such as Dundee Energy Efficiency Advice Project.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <p>1 Scottish Welfare Fund – Crisis Grant</p> <p>People on low incomes may be able to get a grant from the Scottish Welfare Fund in the event of a crisis. This is a one-off payment to help you cope during an emergency or disaster, or due to unexpected expenses. Crisis grants may be given as cash or as vouchers, e.g to buy food or fuel. You may be required to request a hardship payment or benefit advance before being awarded this grant. Crisis grants do not have to be paid back (not a loan).</p> <p>WHO CAN HELP: BC CA CT WR</p> <p>2 Hardship Payment</p> <p>If you have no money because of a sanction, you may be able to claim a hardship payment from the Jobcentre. Hardship payments are not always paid immediately, and they're not available to everyone. Hardship payments of Universal Credit need to be paid back, but hardship payments of JSA or ESA do not.</p> <p>WHO CAN HELP: BC CA CT WR</p> <p>3 Benefit Advance</p> <p>If someone has made a new claim for benefit but has not yet been paid, they may be able to get an advance. Advances are typically paid within 3 working days but you can ask for it to be paid the same day you apply. Benefit advances must be paid back, and the money will be taken from your future benefit payments (a loan). It's important to get advice from one of the services before taking out an advance.</p> <p>WHO CAN HELP: BC CA CT WR</p> <p>4 Challenging a decision</p> <p>You can challenge a benefit decision if your benefit has been stopped/sanctioned/reduced and you believe the decision is wrong. Most benefit decisions need to be challenged within one month.</p> <p>WHO CAN HELP: BC CA CT WR</p> <p>5 Benefit check</p> <p>Some people may need support to make a claim and may not be getting all of the benefits they are entitled to.
