It has set up an invoicing system to allow you to pay for your shopping after it has been delivered in response to people telling them they were worried about running out of cash at home and having to go out to withdraw money in order for volunteers to do their shopping for them. This is an alternative for the people who are no longer able to pay with cash and hope that this will allow them to continue to get the shopping in that they want without having to leave the house or put themselves at more risk.

A WEST End councillor has said that improvements to air quality must not be lost when "normality" returns.

Councillor Fraser Macpherson noted air quality levels across Dundee have "significantly improved" with far less vehicle usage during the coronavirus pandemic.

Lochee Road, which is in Mr Macpherson's ward, ranked amongst Scotland's most polluted streets in a recent survey conducted by Friends of the Earth.

He said levels of nitrogen dioxide had reduced by more than 10% there in recent weeks.

He added: "It is a very challenging time due to Covid-19.

"The council must act to ensure that cleaner air is a long-term benefit to everyone in the city."
