A number of constituents have raised concerns about the lighting on the public pathway that runs to the side of Harris Academy down to Riverside.

Several of the lighting units are in a vandalised state or simply not working.

I reported this to the council's Street Lighting Partnership and have now been advised:

"We have decided that we are not simply going to replace the fittings as it is clear that they are mounted in a location which is easy to access and prone to vandalism.

(We are) currently working on some design calculations with a view to installing columns in their place."

From the Curator of Museum Services at the University of Dundee :


