were promised the 'biggest overhaul of prisons in a generation' but there is no

plan to deal with understaffing and overcrowding — the two biggest challenges facing the prison system.

"A

duty on prisons to reform is of course welcome. But without a plan to back it up, this is simply a symbolic gesture.

"Labour

is open to Governors having greater autonomy, but this must not become a way for Ministers to simply shift responsibility for their policy failures elsewhere.

"And

the Chief Inspector of Prisons has already queried whether league tables could

be meaningful.

"Preventing

cross examination of victims of domestic violence by the perpetrator is welcome. However, the Tories' reckless cuts to legal aid have greatly contributed to this unacceptable situation."
