With barely enough money for food, conflict-displaced Ukrainians struggling to survive, reports UN agency

16 May 2017 — Two-thirds of internally displaced Ukrainians are struggling financially; many without even enough money for food, according to the latest report by the United Nations migration agency on the situation in the crisistorn country.

In its report National Monitoring System on Situation of IDPs in Ukraine, the International Organization for Migration ($\underline{\text{IOM}}$), reveals that on average, income per internally displaced person (IDP) in Ukraine is 1,991 Ukrainian Hryvnia — or \$75 per month, approximately \$2.50 per day. While a loaf of bread costing about 0.40, some 21 per cent are surviving on less than \$2 a day.
